The Beach Town with a History

A stylish and genteel resort during the steamboat era, a casino and gambling hub mid-century, Colonial Beach is the beach town with a history. More presidents were born nearby than anywhere else in the US: Washington, Madison and Monroe. Although Frederick Law Olmstead absconded with our famous white sand for use in Central Park, the well-to-do from Washington, DC still built riverside retreats here in the 19th century, notable among them W. Andrew Bell, father of Alexander Graham Bell, whose family's home still stands proudly overlooking the Potomac. A tragic "Oyster War" took place here in the 20th century.

But its heritage today is more endangered than that of the Osprey. Our remaining historic structures could deteriorate past saving if restoration doesn't start soon.

As a VA Main Street affiliate, Downtown Colonial Beach can save two birds with one stone by using the funds raised from the Osprey Festival for preservation-based revitalization, specifically by completing the process of obtaining state and federal certification for the town's historic district.

The town of Colonial Beach has a storied past. We hope this Osprey Festival will help us to discover in our past, our abundant natural resources, and the friendliness of our warm and inclusive community, the keys to a more prosperous future. Welcome, enjoy yourself and come back again, and again!

SPEAKER BIOS

Mike Callahan Intro to Bird Watching, Osprey talks and Bus Tours Mike Callahan is a naturalist by hobby and profession and is an avid birdwatcher. He is a part time Park Interpreter at Caledon State Park in King George, VA and teaches environmental education for Charles County Public Schools in Maryland at Nanjemoy Creek Environmental Education Center. Mike is the current Raptor Conservation Committee Chairman and a past President of Southern Maryland Audubon Society.

Joe Cooney, Lead guide, Northern Neck Audubon Society Could Joe have developed his affinity for birds from spending 24 years in the Air Force? Perhaps. But these days his interest in flight has more to do with spotting birds on the wing. He attests to the accessibility of birdwatching, one reason he loves it, having only been involved for the last four years. Courtney & Warren French. Hummingbirds Courtney and husband Warren have been avid birders and backyard bird feeders for most of their lives so it was an easy transition to opening Wild Bird Unlimited as a second career where they could share their passion with others. Formerly a long term care nurse, Courtney is now keeping our bird population on life support.

Melissa Gross. Intro to Bird Watching, walks & more The current president of the Northern Neck Audubon Society, Melissa dearly loves osprey, bird walks, and other active outdoor pastimes. Her grandparents nurtured a respect for nature in general and ospreys in particular. After spending 23 years as a firefighter/medic, she returned to her fundamental interests in birds, nature, and music, but added in environmental activism. She has a BS in Biology from Mary Washington College.

Anne Little, VA Bluebirds and Creating Habitat in Your Backyard Past President and Co-Founder of the Virginia Bluebird Society, (VBS). Ann and her husband Carl also lead Tree Fredericksburg, a group that has planted over 6,500 trees in the city of Fredericksburg. They lead the effort to save the Virginia Bluebird and repopulate them throughout Virginia and elsewhere.

Pam Narney, Osprey Bus Tours Ospreys have had a major influence on Pam's life. In fact that's one of the major reasons she and her husband moved to Colonial Beach. When looking at a house, Pam and husband John were looking at a house when they saw an osprey and his mate getting romantic. It proved love at first sight for the Narneys as well and they've been relishing the local ospreys ever since, so much so that Pam's become known as the "Osprey Queen."

Captain Wes Jackson, Boat Tours Captain Wes is a USCG certified 100 ton captain who has spent his entire life working the water, and serving the community in the Fire/EMS service. He owns two boats Miss Kayleigh and Honey Bee. The honey bee is 48ft and certified for up to 30 passengers for tours/cruising and fishing.

Mitzi Saffos and Jean Conanty, Trolley Tour History Guides. Mitzi, who majored in American Studies at Mary Washington College, is Curator of the Colonial Beach Museum, and co-owner of the Colonial Beach Brewery. Jean is the Museum's Volunteer Coordinator and organizes the town's annual Fathers' Day Classic Car Show.


ARTIST BIOS



ACTIVITIES

Guide-led Bird Walks

Joe Cooney and Melissa Gross, Guides. Handicapped accessible bird walks along the Colonial Beach Boardwalk and Beach every hour on the half hour. Provides an introduction to shorebirds, including Ospreys, as well as any other birds along the route. Learn about creating a list of the birds you see, their numbers, and characteristics. You'll be amazed at the variety of birds you can see in a relatively short distance.

Osprey Nests and History Trolley Tour

Throughout Colonial Beach. Presenter: Pam Narney, Ospreys. Jean Conaty and Mitzi Saffos, History of Colonial Beach. Pam the "Osprey Queen," shares her expertise and stories from her long term love of the ospreys. Historians share the history of Colonial Beach including some of wild and wooly tales of life in a river town.

Golf Cart Tour of Nests on Colonial Beach Point

Abbreviated information about the Ospreys and Colonial Beach history, but tour of some of the most scenic portions of Colonial Beach. Some visits to Marinas with a concentration of osprey nests. Golf Carts are being provided courtesy of Beach Cart Rental and Custom Cartz, LLC

Native Plant Sale, Rankin's Hardware. Continues all weekend. Plants recommended by Anne Little, presenter on creating habitat for birds in your back yard.

Boat Rides (Weather permitting) down the Potomac and around Monroe Bay to get up close and personal with the ospreys will be available for an extra fee of \$20 per person. The boat will leave every 2 hours from the small pier just north of the long Town Pier starting at 10 a.m. Sign-up and pay at the Downtown Colonial Beach Exhibit on Town Hill.

BIRD TALKS

Introduction to Bird Watching

Get a quick and basic introduction to birdwatching with this presentation. Learn what you need to get started and how to go about birdwatching as a beginner.

Ospreys and Other Raptors

Learn about the Osprey and raptors or birds of prey that can be found in Colonial Beach. Will cover Bald Eagle, Red-tailed Hawk, Red-shouldered Hawk, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Cooper's Hawk, Eastern Screech Owl, Barred Owl and Great-horned Owl.

Hummingbirds on Parade

The Ups, Downs and Sideways of the World's Smallest Birds. Presenters Courtney and Warren French. Bird talk about hummingbirds, specifically attracting and feeding, migration patterns, mating and raising their young, planting for hummingbirds and some fun and interesting trivia and common myths about this species.

Bluebird Basics: Attracting & Keeping Bluebirds in Your Yard.

Participants will be shown how to attract these beautiful birds to your yard, give hints on how to provide a safe habitat and will provide information on native vegetation that you can plant that will provide food for the bluebirds. There will also be information and other native cavity nesting birds in Virginia and how you can help increase their chances for survival. Will also cover efforts to preserve and increase Virginia's bluebird population and how you can help.

Osprey Conservation and Platforms.

Presenter: Matt Overton. Talk will cover Dominion Energy's avian program, osprey conservation efforts, and constructing osprey platforms.





PARKING

Parking is available in the Wilder Lot for \$2.00 per hour. Bird walks leave from Northern Neck Audubon Exhibit in the Festival area on Town Hill.



The Rappahannock Wildlife Refuge Friends is an independent, nonprofit group of individuals dedicated to supporting the National Wildlife Refuge System and promoting awareness of the Rappahannock River Valley National Wildlife Refuge through education and support.

Downtown Colonial Beach, Inc. Ticket sales, pick up program, sign up for activities. Downtown Colonial Beach's exhibit also provides information about its purpose and projects. They will be selling Red Geraniums for their annual "Plant the Town Red" Campaign, and will be raffling off a mosaic of an osprey on the wing, an original work recently created by multi-media artist Eric Nelson.

Colonial Beach Chamber of Commerce The Chamber of Commerce will have the new directories of businesses and events calendar for 2019. Cards will also be available there for the "Find the Bird Scavenger Hunt" through local retail stores, adleries, and the Historical Museum.

Colonial Beach Outfitters describes itself as creatively outfitting the community through collaborations! They bring out the fun in Colonial Beach, coming up with untold ways to bring the community together to play. They're involved with boating, entertainment, kayak rentals, all kinds of recreation.

BAMM (Beach Arts Music and Mentoring) program was formed out of a common belief that many local youth lacked access to art, music, life skills, and career guidance and to raise funds for a mentoring program to assist them. BAMM volunteers will be leading two children's craft activities: painting of bird houses and making bird feeders out of pinecones.

BIRD WATCHING

IN AND AROUND COLONIAL BEACH

PARKS AND REFUGES

Caledon State Park, 11617 Caledon Rd., King George, VA 22485 Caledon is a "National Natural Landmark" known for its old growth forest and summer home to many American bald eagles. Trails, including Boyd's Hole Trail, which leads to the Potomac River, are open year-round from dawn to dusk. On Sunday April 14th, there will be guided eagle tour at 11 am, and an owl tour at 3 pm.

Westmoreland State Park, 145 Cliff Road, Montross, VA 22520. Birding enthusiasts find the park an excellent site for spotting American bald eagles, ospreys, kingfishers, great blue herons, common terns, green herons and gulls, as well as wintering waterfowl. Hand-curated trail maps and driving directions as well as detailed reviews and photos from hikers, campers and nature lovers of their six miles of trails can be found at the Visitor Center. It has cabins and tenting sites as well as an Olympic-sized swimming pool, fishing pier, and power-boat ramp. Hunting for ancient shark teeth is another popular pastime there.

Rapahannock River Valley Wildlife Refuge, Warsaw, VA (go to www.fws.gov/refuge/Rappahannock_River_Valley/about.html for exact directions.) The refuge currently consists of 9,030 acres with units in Essex, King George, Caroline, Richmond, and Westmoreland counties that include fresh water tidal marsh, forest swamp, upland deciduous forest, mixed pine forest, and grassland habitats. In 2007, areas of the refuge were designated by the National Audubon Society as an Important Bird Area (IBA) based on criteria such as population, high concentration in a limited area, or other factors. The IBA designation coincides with areas of high bald eagle concentration.

HISTORIC SITES

George Washingtons Birthplace Monument, 1732 Popes Creek Road, Colonial Beach, VA 22443. Birthplace of our first president, the park preserves the heart of the Washingtons' lands in America. Generations of Washingtons lived on these lands and established a legacy of public service, leadership, and love of the land. While the more important facet of this jewel of a park is the historical significance, it is also full of birds and wildlife. Many different habitats are found here, from forest to field to brackish bay which makes for quite a diverse list of birds and plant life. You can take a short walk along the nature trail to the picnic area or a long walk or short drive to the marsh and beach area and see a great many species of birds. The link for the monument provides additional links for bird lists, animal tracks, and lists reptiles and amphibians that can be found here. Open 9 am – 5 pm, seven days a week. No fee.

James Monroe's Birthplace, 4460 James Monroe Highway, Colonial Beach, VA 22443. Just outside Colonial Beach on Rt. 205, Monroe's birthplace is a lovely place where a reproduction of the Monroe Family home is now under construction. The Visitor Center there also serves as a small museum about James Monroe and Monroe family history. Behind the house is a long concrete walk that serves as a timeline of President Monroe's life that is circled by a large path that passes by the site's connection to the water. The woods' combination of waterside, open area and woods circling that area is nurtures a large variety of birdlife. Usually open from Memorial to Labor Day, the Visitor's Center is open Sunday, the 14th, especially for visitors to the Osprey Festival from 11 am to 4 pm.

James Madison Birthplace, Belle Grove Plantation Bed & Breakfast, 9221 Belle Grove Drive, King George, VA 22485 (located on the east side of the Rappahannock River across from Port Royal) The plantation was established in 1670 on the banks of the Rappahannock River, the mansion built in 1791. The grounds offers excellent bird watching opportunities for local, migrating, and rare birds, including a resident osprey couple "James and Dolley." Grounds and mansion tours available. See website at www.bellegroveplantation.com.

Stratford Hall, 483 Great House Rd, Stratford, VA 22558. 17 miles southeast of Colonial Beach, Stratford Hall is the magnificent original mansion that was home to four generations of the Lee Family. On the expansive grounds there are several gardens and nature trails. Of special interest to birdwatchers would be the chance to spot Virginia bluebirds thanks to the large number of properly built and maintained bluebird houses there. (Note: visitors are cautioned to not look into the bird houses to avoid disturbing the nesting pairs.)
